Serving America's State Legislators

With nearly 2,000 members, ALEC is the nation's largest nonpartisan, individual membership association of state legislators. ALEC is one of America's most dynamic public-private partnerships with nearly 300 corporate and private foundation members. ALEC provides its public and private sector members with a unique opportunity to work together to develop policies and programs that effectively promote the Jeffersonian principles of free markets, limited government, federalism, and individual liberty.

ALEC Scorecard

ALEC has developed comprehensive educational projects designed to promote free-market public policy at the state level. While these projects produce and disseminate a wide range of research and informational material, the centerpiece is model legislation. To date, ALEC members have considered, written, and approved hundreds of model bills, resolutions and policy statements. Historically during each legislative cycle, ALEC legislators introduce over 1,000 pieces of legislation based on these models, approximately 18% of which are enacted.

The ALEC Annual Meeting

The ALEC Annual Meeting has grown to become one of the nation's most prestigious state level conferences, and has been described as the "largest gathering of conservatives held each year." Nearly 2,000 state legislators, business executives, and public policy experts gather for four days to discuss the issues and develop policy.

Each meeting features 35 to 40 workshops, plenary sessions, and task force meetings, as well as numerous networking opportunities at social events.

Value of Membership

ALEC serves as the "state legislators' think tank." ALEC's policy staff provides research, policy analysis, scholarly articles, reference materials, legislative bill tracking, and expert testimony on a wide spectrum of issues.

ALEC Model Legislation

The centerpiece of Task Force projects is ALEC model legislation. ALEC is the only state legislative organization that adopts policies and creates model legislation for its members to use in their states. To date, ALEC has nearly 1,000 pieces of model legislation.

Issue Analysis

Short analyses of topical issues that provide perfect preparation for talking points and media briefings.

Report Cards and Special Studies

State-by-state analyses of critical issues such as education and tax and fiscal policy.

ALEC Academies and State Issue Seminars

Throughout the year ALEC conducts issue-specific seminars in 20 to 30 state capitols. ALEC Academies are special two-day intensive programs on specific issues, featuring national experts as faculty.

This magazine for ALEC members is published up to nine times throughout the year. ALEC members can read and learn about issues shaping public policy, the success of policy in state legislatures, and submit their own articles.

ALEC National Task Forces

ALEC's 9 National Task Forces serve as public policy laboratories where legislators develop model policies to use across the country. Task Forces also commission research, publish issue papers, convene workshops and issue briefings, and serve as clearinghouses of information on free market policies in the states.

Unique to ALEC Task Forces is their public-private partnership, a synergistic alliance that identifies issues and then responds with common sense, results-oriented policies. Legislators welcome their private sector counterparts to the table as equals, working in unison to solve the challenges facing the nation. The Task Forces are:

States & Nation Policy Summit

The States and Nation Policy Summit introduces the ALEC agenda to newly-elected and freshman state legislators for a three-day conference of intensive educational sessions addressing issues that will be at the top of their legislative agendas the following year. The Summit is an ideal opportunity for the public and private sectors to develop free market policies to promote economic growth, limited government, and federalism. Speakers include national leaders and renowned policy experts, as well as senior executives from the private sector.

Spring Task Force Summit

The Summit is an intensive three-day meeting of ALEC's task force members, designed to keep members abreast of new developments in the states, and includes Task Force meetings, hearings on pressing issues, and plenary meal sessions with policy discussions and presentations. Only sitting Task Force members attend these meetings with the goal of setting the Task Force agenda for the upcoming year.
